

# § 200.413(c): Salary of Administrative and Clerical Staff

- Salaries normally treated as indirect costs
- Charging as direct cost appropriate only if:
  - Services integral to a project or activity
  - Individuals specifically identified with the project or activity
  - Included in the budget or have prior written approval
  - Not also recovered as indirect costs



# § 200.438: Entertainment Costs

- Generally unallowable
- Limited exceptions for programmatic purposes











# § 200.439: Equipment and Other Capital Expenditures

- Unallowable as direct cost unless non-Federal entity (NFE) obtains prior written approval from the Federal awarding agency:
  - Expenditures for general purpose equipment, buildings, and land
  - Expenditures for improvements to land, buildings, or equipment which materially increase their value or useful life

- Allowable as direct cost:
  - Expenditures for special purpose equipment
  - Items with a unit cost of \$5,000 or more require prior written approval of the Federal awarding agency or pass-through entity





# § 200.440: Exchange Rates

- Cost increases for fluctuations
  - · Is allowable if funding is available
  - Requires prior written approval if additional Federal funding is needed or funding costs results in reducing the scope of the project
- Determine if additional funding needed before expiration of award

# § 200.441: Fines, Penalties, Damages, and Other Settlements

- Unallowable costs
  - Violations
  - Alleged violations
  - Failure to comply

### Exceptions

- Result of compliance with specific provisions of the award
- Prior written approval of the Federal awarding agency



# § 200.447: Insurance and Indemnification

- Allowable if required or approved and maintained pursuant to Federal award
- Subject to limitations:
  - Types, extent, and cost of coverage in accordance with NFE policy and sound business practice
  - Medical liability insurance only to the extent that Federal research programs involve human subjects or training of participants in research techniques



# § 200.447: Insurance and Indemnification, cont'd

- Unallowable coverage
  - Risk of loss or damage to Federal Government property
  - Lives of trustees, officers, or other employees when the NFE is identified as the beneficiary
  - Correcting defects in the NFE's materials or workmanship
  - Actual losses which could have been covered by permissible insurance



# § 200.454: Memberships, Subscriptions, and Professional Activity Costs

### Allowable

- Membership in business, technical, and professional organizations
- Subscriptions to business, professional, and technical periodicals
- Membership in any civic or community organization with prior written approval

### Unallowable

- Membership in any country club or social or dining club or organization
- Membership in organizations whose primary purpose is lobbying





# § 200.455: Organization Costs

- Unallowable unless with prior written approval
- Costs connected to establishment or reorganization:
  - Incorporation fees
  - · Brokers' fees
  - Fees to promoters, organizers, or management consultants
  - Fees to attorneys, accountants, or investment counselors

# § 200.456: Participant Costs

- Are allowable with prior written approval
- Defined in Section 200.75
- Includes costs such as:
  - Stipends or subsistence allowances
  - Travel allowances
  - Registration fees for conferences or training projects









# § 200.458: Pre-Award Costs

- Allowable if:
  - Incurred prior to effective date of award
  - Incurred in anticipation of award
  - Must be necessary for efficient and timely performance of the scope of work
  - Are allowable only if costs would have been allowed if incurred after date of award
- NFE incurs any pre-award costs at its own risk



# **Pre-Award Costs Example**

- NFE purchases equipment prior to start of field work
- Cost is necessary for efficient and timely performance
- Cost is allowable if incurred after award
- NFE assumes risk of costs incurred before award

# § 200.474: Travel Costs

- Requires prior written approval for:
  - Section 200.444 General costs of government, travel of officials when specifically related to an award
  - Dependents when duration of travel exceeds 6 months







### **Miscellaneous Other Costs**

- Prior written approval required for:
  - Section 200.430(h) IHE compensation over institutional base salary
  - Section 200.462 Rearrangement and reconversion costs
